The American Revolution in Québec: An Invasion and an Invitation. Context, perspectives, and repercussions.

Montréal, November 7th, 2025 — On the occasion of the 250th anniversary of the surrender of Montréal to the rebel armed forces of the American colonies, the **Château Ramezay — Historic Site and Museum of**

Montréal invites you to the seminar “The American Revolution in Québec: An Invasion and an Invitation. Context, Perspectives, and Repercussions.”, which will take place at the Grande Bibliothèque on **November 15th from 9:15 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.**

History

The Château Ramezay was at the heart of the events of the American Revolution that took place on Canadian soil. On November 13th, 1775, the day after the city's surrender, Montréal opened its gates to General Richard Montgomery and his troops. Montgomery established his headquarters at the Château Ramezay, a seat of power that Governor Guy Carleton occupied until November 11th, before leaving the city to take refuge behind the fortifications of Québec. The Continental Army occupied the city and the Château until June 15th, 1776.

On **November 13th, 2025**, exactly 250 years after the surrender of Montréal, join us for a historical reenactment at **10 a.m. and 1 p.m.** to hear the discussions between General Montgomery and three of the twelve Montrealers (James McGill, Pierre-Méru Panet, and Jean-Louis Besnard dit Carignant) appointed to represent the city's population during the negotiations of the surrender terms. Afterwards, witness the raising of the "Grand Union" flag at the Château. A lecture by Mr. Dave Noël will follow the 1:00 p.m. reenactment. Visit our website for complete details.
